Erin Fanning, resident, commented on side yard setbacks, and a response by public safety on October 4, 2018 and how removal by gurney was made difficult.

Marlo Jenkins, resident, lives near Mickey Cox Elementary, notied that there was no park near her home and available land nearby and requested the city looking into turning that empty lot into a park.

Jean Joneson, resident, commented on concerns with lack of parks in her neighborhood on the east side of the city and the lack of a dog park in her neighborhood.

16. 6:10 - APPROVED - RES. 18-144, CUP2005-24A2, APPROVING A CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT AMENDING THE MASTER SITE PLAN FOR PORTAL SIERRA II WITHIN THE RESEARCH AND TECHNOLOGY PARK, LOCATED ON THE WEST SIDE OF TEMPERANCE AVENUE, NORTH OF ALLUVIAL AVENUE, GREYHAWK, LLC., OWNER AND APPLICANT; CENTERLINE DESIGN LLC., REPRESENTATIVE. CONTINUED FROM THE MEETING OF OCTOBER 8, 2018.

It was the consensus of Council to move item number 16 to the first public hearing as it was continued from the meeting of October 8, 2018. Assistant Planner Orlando Ramirez presented a report on a request to approve a conditional use permit amending the master site plan for Portal Sierra II within the Research and Technology Park, located on the west side of Temperance Avenue, north of Alluvial Avenue. The applicant is requesting approval of a conditional use permit to amend the master site plan for the business campus Planned Unit Development (PUD) known as Portal Sierra II within the R-T (Research and Technology) Park Zone District located west of Temperance Avenue and north of Alluvial Avenue. Approval of this conditional use permit will memorialize a revised layout of the previous master site plan. This Project was continued from the September 10, 2018 meeting to address Council comments. The Project was brought before the City Council for consideration on September 10, 2018. The applicant sought approval of a revised site plan which modified the layout of the existing approved master site plan. The proposed revisions included replacing the private street through the undeveloped portion of the business campus with a 36 foot wide driveway with 90 degree parking stalls on each side as well as modification to the number of buildings and size of buildings, and placement of future buildings on the site. The applicant's project proposed nine buildings ranging from 7,020 square feet to 17,424 square feet.

The Project was continued to the October 8, 2018 meeting to allow the applicant time to address the concerns expressed by Council specific to layout of the site plan. Members of the Council felt that the site plan deviated from the original intent of the business campus in regards to the layout and the campus feel. Council provided the applicant with direction to revise the proposal to create a campus-like setting and to clarify the "medical-office" use intended for the smaller 7,020 square foot buildings.

The applicant was encouraged to address Council concerns and has modified the plan by replacing two of the 10,628 square foot buildings with a larger 37,490 square foot building

to encourage larger R-T Park users into the business campus. The applicant is also providing a wider and more enhanced path of travel connecting the existing portion of the business campus leading to a landscaped trail entry feature proposed on the west end of the business campus. The revised layout will provide enhanced crosswalks as a part of the pedestrian connection, enhancement of the adjacent landscaping as well as additional open space gathering areas more conducive to a campus setting environment.

Jeff Johnston, representing the applicant, commented on, and spoke in support of the project. Marlo Jenkins, resident, questioned who would be using the trail.

Discussion by the Council. Motion by Councilmember Flores, seconded by Councilmember Mouanoutoua, for the Council to approve a conditional use permit amending the master site plan for Portal Sierra II within the Research and Technology Park, located on the west side of Temperance Avenue, north of Alluvial Avenue. Motion carried 4-0-1 with Mayor Whalen absent.

Finance Director Jay Schengel presented a report on actions related to annexation of territory (Annexation #54 - T6186 - Southeast Corner of Bullard and Leonard) to the city of Clovis Community Facilities District (CFD) No. 2004-1 (Police and Fire Services). Since the condition to establish a CFD was imposed on the developments being processed by the City, developments proceeding after March 8, 2004 must petition to be annexed to the existing CFD. This action is required to begin the process of annexation provided by the conditions of approval of the development entitlements. Jay Schengel provided an overview of Annexation #54. There being no public comment, Mayor Pro Tem Bessinger closed the public portion. Discussion by the Council.

Motion by Councilmember Ashbeck, seconded by Councilmember Flores, for the Council to approve **Resolution 18-145**, for the Council to approve a Resolution annexing territory (Annexation #54 - T6186 - Southeast Corner of Bullard and Leonard) to the city of Clovis

Community Facilities District (CFD) No. 2004-1 (Police and Fire Services) and calling a special landowner election to annex territory (Annexation #54) to City of Clovis Community Facilities District No. 2004-1 (Police and Fire Services). Motion carried 4-0-1 with Mayor Whalen absent.

City Clerk John Holt reported out that he was in receipt of one ballot representing 35 votes all in favor and noted unanimous passage of the ballot measure. There being no comment, Mayor Whalen closed the public portion. Discussion by the Council.

Motion by Councilmember Ashbeck, seconded by Councilmember Flores, for the Council to approve **Resolution 18-146**, a Resolution of the City of Clovis declaring the results of a special landowner election and directing recording of the Notice of Special Tax Lien for City of Clovis Community Facilities District No. 2004-1 (Police and Fire Services). City Planner Bryan Araki presented a report on various items associated with approximately 18.13 acres of land located at the northeast corner of Ashlan and Locan Avenues. The applicant is requesting to amend the General Plan Land Use Diagram and Loma Vista Specific Plan Designations for approximately 11.37 acres of property at the northeast corner of Ashlan and Locan Avenues, from Public/Quasi-Public Facilities

classification to Medium High Density Residential (7.1 to 15.0 DU/AC) and rezone approximately 18.13 acres from the R-A (Single-Family Residential – 24,000 Sq. Ft.) Zone District to the R-1-PRD (Planned Residential Development) and P-F (Public Facilities) Zone Districts. Additionally, the applicant is requesting a vesting tentative tract map approval for a 94-lot non-gated single-family planned residential development with private streets, increased lot coverage and reduced building setbacks. The applicant is proposing a Homeowner's Association with this Project. Approval of this Project would allow the developer to continue processing development drawings.

Dirk Poeschel, representing the applicant, commented and spoke in support of the proposed project. Mark Johnson, Sonrise Baptist Church, spoke in support. Leo Wilson, applicant, commented on the developer's plans on putting the fire access road on the south side of the church. Chris Holland, area resident, spoke in support and raised concerns with parking. Jean Joneson, resident, spoke in opposition due to concerns with the northwest corner of Ashlan and Locan Avenues, the park is too small, overcrowding of schools, water shortage, police and fire services, and traffic. Theresa Sabaston, area resident, spoke in support.

Motion by Councilmember Ashbeck, seconded by Councilmember Flores, for the Council to approve **Resolution 18-147**, approving an environmental finding of a Mitigated Negative Declaration for General Plan Amendment GPA2018-01, Rezone R2018-07 and Vesting Tentative Tract Map TM6225. Motion carried 4-0-1 with Mayor Whalen absent.

Motion by Councilmember Ashbeck, seconded by Councilmember Flores, for the Council to approve **Resolution 18-148**, approving a request to amend the General Plan and Loma Vista Specific Plan to re-designate approximately 11.37 acres of land from Public/Quasi-Public Facilities classification to Medium High Density Residential (7.1 to 15.0 DU/AC) classification with the added condition that final Site Plan approval will be conditioned on a certified General Plan Housing Element by the California Department of Housing and Community Development. Motion carried 4-0-1 with Mayor Whalen absent.

Motion by Councilmember Ashbeck, seconded by Councilmember Flores, for the Council to approve the Introduction, **Ord. 18-25**, R2018-07, approving a rezone of approximately 18.13 acres of land from the R-A (Single-Family Residential – 24,000 Sq. Ft.) Zone District to the R-1-PRD (Planned Residential Development) and P-F (Public Facilities) Zone Districts. Motion carried 4-0-1 with Mayor Whalen absent.

Motion by Councilmember Ashbeck, seconded by Councilmember Flores, for the Council to approve **Resolution 18-149**, TM6225, approving a vesting tentative tract map for a 94-lot single-family planned residential development on approximately 11.37 acres of land. Motion carried 4-0-1 with Mayor Whalen absent.

 - A. APPROVED **RES. 18-150**, GPA2018-05, A TEXT MODIFICATION TO THE GENERAL PLAN TO ADD MULTIPLE-FAMILY HOUSING TO THE LIST OF TYPICAL USES IN PUBLIC, SCHOOLS, AND WATER DESIGNATIONS AND

ADD THE RHN (REGIONAL HOUSING NEEDS) OVERLAY ZONE DISTRICT AS A TYPICAL USE WITHIN RESIDENTIAL ZONED PROPERTIES.

B. APPROVED INTRODUCTION - ORD. 18-26, OA2018-03, A TEXT MODIFICATION TO THE DEVELOPMENT CODE TO ADD MULTIPLE-FAMILY HOUSING AS A PERMITTED USE IN THE P-F (PUBLIC FACILITY) ZONE DISTRICT AND TO ADD A NEW RHN (REGIONAL HOUSING NEEDS) OVERLAY ZONE DISTRICT.

City Planner Bryan Araki presented a report on items associated with the 2015-2023 Housing Element Regional Housing Needs Assessment (RHNA). Staff is recommending amendments to both the General Plan and Development Code to address the City's Fourth Cycle Regional Housing Needs Assessment related to the General Plan's Housing Element. The recommended modifications are necessary to maintain certification of the Housing Element and General Plan compliance. The City of Clovis is currently addressing a shortfall of affordable housing identified in the Fourth Cycle 2007-2012, Regional Housing Needs Assessment (RHNA). The Fourth Cycle RHNA included a shortfall of land to accommodate 4,425 units at a minimum density of 20 units per acre. In the current Housing Element (adopted in April of 2016) the City committed to a rezone program for the unaccommodated 4,425 units to be completed no later than December On July 22, 2016, the State Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) found the Housing Element to be in compliance with State law, based on a commitment to provide "adequate zoning on at least 221 acres of land by December 31, 2016 to cover the "carry-over" unaccommodated need from the Fourth Cycle RHNA of 4,425 lower-income units."

Marlo Jenkins, resident, commented on concerns raised about the proposal. Molly Nolan, resident, questioned staff about the proposal.

Motion by Councilmember Ashbeck, seconded by Councilmember Flores, for the Council to approve **Resolution 18-150**, GPA2018-05, a text modification to the General Plan to add Multiple-Family Housing to the list of typical uses in Public, Schools, and Water designations and add the RHN (Regional Housing Needs) Overlay Zone District as a typical use within residential zoned properties. Motion carried 4-0-1 with Mayor Whalen absent.

Motion by Councilmember Ashbeck, seconded by Councilmember Flores, for the Council to approve the introduction of **Ordinance 18-26**, OA2018-03, a text modification to the Development Code to add Multiple-Family Housing as a permitted use in the P-F (Public Facility) Zone District and to add a new RHN (Regional Housing Needs) Overlay Zone District. Motion carried 4-0-1 with Mayor Whalen absent.

RECOMMENDATION

For City Council to approve the waiver of the City's standard purchasing procedure and approve the emergency purchase of two (2) Cleaver Brooks Clearfire 750 compact condensing boilers from EMCOR-Mesa Energy Systems, Inc. for the proposed total price of \$47,700.58, to replace the obsolete boilers currently providing heat to the Fleet Division's vehicle bays located within the Operations and Maintenance Service Center Facility.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Fleet boilers, which provide heat to the facility's vehicle bays, are obsolete with parts availability scarce. The mechanical failure of these units is increasing each year, creating a less than ideal work environment when temperatures drop below 50 degrees. Staff conducted a Request for Quote (RFQ) process for the purchase of new boilers. All three guotes received exceeded the \$45,000 maximum threshold allowed for an RFQ process. Staff is requesting the City Council waive the formal purchasing procedures required for purchases exceeding \$45,000, allowing an emergency purchase as allowed by Section 2.7.08 of the Clovis Municipal Code and award the purchase to EMCOR, who submitted the lowest priced quote.

BACKGROUND

Staff is requesting an emergency purchase to replace two (2) boilers currently providing heat to the Fleet Division's vehicle bays. The two (2) current boilers, manufactured by Rite Boilers, have heated the Fleet Division's shop area for the past 15 years; however, there have been numerous mechanical failures over the past two years. The current boiler models are obsolete with parts availability extremely scarce. An issue with the unit's combustion motor during 2017 required the units to be deemed non-operational for a significant period. It took three (3) weeks for parts to be located, purchased and delivered for the repair. This condition placed the mechanics in a work environment where temperatures averaged from 35° – 55° within the shop area.

Staff estimated the cost of the two boilers at less than \$45,000 based upon the 2014 purchase of identical boilers for Clovis Civic Center. Therefore, consistent with the City's *Purchasing Manual* for purchases up to \$45,000, staff generated a Request for Quote (RFQ) for the boilers and posted the RFQ to the City's web-based e-procurement system. The system electronically distributed the invitation to all locally registered vendors interested in supplying boiler products. The City's e-procurement system verified the RFQ invitation was sent to twelve (12) vendors, of which seven (7) vendors downloaded RFQ documents for review. Three (3) vendors submitted electronic quotes to the City. The three (3) quotes submitted met all of the City's proposal criteria.

A summary of vendor's final costs are listed below:

The RFQ documents requested vendors to include all shipping, handling, delivery, tariffs, taxes and any incurred ancillary charges into their total price. All quotes submitted exceeded the \$45,000 maximum threshold allowed for a RFQ process. A formal Request for Bid (RFB) process, consistent with the City's *Purchasing Manual* for purchases exceeding \$45,000, would take approximately five (5) weeks to complete. Compounded with an approximate lead time of four (4) weeks for delivery once a purchase order was approved and issued, the boilers would not arrive onsite until January 2019.

Due to time constraints and with cold weather imminent, staff is requesting the City Council waive the City's standard purchasing procedures and allow for the emergency purchase of two (2) Cleaver Brooks Clearfire 750 boilers. Section 2.7.08

of the *Clovis Municipal Code* allows for emergency purchases, exempt from the requirements of a formal bidding procedure, when conducted in accordance with the City's *Purchasing Manual* and approved by the City Council.

Staff is recommending the immediate purchase of two (2) Cleaver Brooks Clearfire 750 MBTU boilers from EMCOR, consistent with the lowest priced quote submitted through the RFQ process. EMCOR is currently the City's HVAC maintenance vendor.

Engineered design plans have been approved by the City's Building Division and a building permit has been issued. The City's Facilities Maintenance Section will begin installation of the boilers upon delivery, with a projected early-December, 2019 start date.

FISCAL IMPACT

EMCOR's proposed price is \$47,700.58. The City of Clovis Transit Section has applied for and received full funding from Senate Bill 1's (SB1's) State of Good Repair Program for the complete boiler retrofit project, therefore, there will be no fiscal impact to the City's budget.

REASON FOR RECOMMENDATION

The Fleet boilers, which provide heat to the facility's vehicle bays, are obsolete with parts availability scarce. Recent mechanical failures have rendered the units unusable for periods up to three (3) weeks. The Facilities Maintenance Section is scheduled to replace the units prior to January 2019. An emergency purchase is necessary to meet this timeline. Upon receipt of a purchase order, EMCOR has indicated a 4-week timeframe for delivery.

Pursuant to the City's *Purchasing Manual*, purchases of items/services exceeding \$45,000.00 require City Council approval.

ACTIONS FOLLOWING APPROVAL

Staff will draft a purchase order for City Manager approval to initiate the purchase of two (2) Cleaver Brooks Clearfire 750 boilers from EMCOR for the purchase price of \$47,700.58. Facilities Maintenance staff will initiate installation of the boilers upon receipt.

RECOMMENDATION

For the City Council to approve a resolution amending the Fire Chief, Deputy Fire Chief and Battalion Chief Classifications, and approve a resolution amending the City's Position Allocation Plan for FY 18-19 in the Fire Department by adding one (1) Deputy Fire Chief position and deleting one (1) Battalion Chief position.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Following a review of the Fire Management classifications it is necessary to amend these classifications to reflect the name changes of the management certifications from the national and state fire training accreditation programs. An assessment of work assignment needs was conducted in the Fire Department and it is recommended that one (1) Deputy Fire Chief position be added and one (1) Battalion Chief position be deleted from the Position Allocation Plan. Modification of both the City's Classification Plan and the Position Allocation Plan requires the City Council's approval.

BACKGROUND

The Fire Department has recently evaluated the work assignments in the department and has determined that the addition of one (1) Deputy Fire Chief position and the elimination of one (1) Battalion Chief position will more efficiently support the current needs of the department. The desired change results in the need to modify the City's Position Allocation Plan which requires Council Approval.

In addition, a review of the Fire Chief, Deputy Fire Chief and Battalion Chief classifications has determined that each of these classifications should be updated to more accurately reflect certification names from the national and state Fire Training Accreditation Programs. The revised classifications will now list the correct certification names that are required for each of the positions.

FISCAL IMPACT

The fiscal impact of salary and benefits for the remainder of FY 18-19 is approximately an additional \$6,000. There are adequate funds in the Fire Department budget to cover the costs of this position.

REASON FOR RECOMMENDATION

The addition of one (1) Deputy Fire Chief and the elimination of one (1) Battalion Chief will provide the advanced level administrative support necessary to improve function in the department. Modifications to the City's Position Allocation Plan require the City Council's approval.

The proposed amendments to the Fire Chief, Deputy Fire Chief and Battalion Chief classifications are recommended to identify the correct names of the certifications that are required for each of the positions. The recommended changes to the City's Classification Plan require the City Council's approval.

ACTIONS FOLLOWING APPROVAL

The updated Fire Chief, Deputy Fire Chief and Battalion Chief specifications and the revised position allocation plan for the Fire Department will be modified as noted in Exhibits A and B attached.

Exhibit A

City of Clovis

DESCRIPTION:

Under administrative direction by the City Manager, plans, directs, and organizes the City's Fire Department; advises the City Manager and City Council regarding the City's fire protection services; and performs related duties as required.

CLASS CHARACTERISTICS:

This single-position class represents the chief executive and operational officer of the Fire Department. The incumbent is responsible to the City Manager for the effectiveness and quality of fire prevention, fire suppression, and emergency preparedness of the City. The position in this class acts with a high degree of independence of action in the assigned area of responsibility. Direction received consists of the assignment of the responsibility to attain objectives according to policy guidelines. Incumbents are expected to develop methods and procedures and solve problems encountered. Except where a deviation in policy is involved, most work is not reviewed directly by the supervisor and when work is reviewed, the review is directed toward final outcomes and results; and performs related duties as required.

EXAMPLES OF DUTIES:

Plans, organizes, coordinates, controls and administers the activities of personnel performing fire suppression, fire prevention, and emergency preparedness; makes recommendations for the establishment and maintenance of a superior fire protection service; directs all safety and non-safety personnel; makes assignments and supervises subordinate officers in the care and maintenance of equipment, stations, and other materials; supervises subordinate officers in the development and operation of fire training, prevention, and emergency preparedness programs; initiates and advises on the development of ordinances and regulations; reviews reports on departmental activities; prepares reports for the City Manager and City Council; prepares Department budget and goals/objectives; supervises the preparation and maintenance of records and reports; prepares long-range plans for the development of the Department; meets with community groups and officials to explain and improve the programs of the Department; attends conferences and meetings related to the Fire Department's mission; coordinates activities of the Department with those of other departments responsible for water service on problems relative to the Fire Department's mission; conducts performance evaluations; hires and disciplines subordinate employees; responds to and processes employee grievances; explains policies, procedures, and objectives of the City and the Department to staff by written directive and by oral communication; establishes standards of performance for each position supervised; conducts staff meetings; develops staff development programs; and performs related work as required.

TYPICAL QUALIFICATIONS:

LICENSE AND CERTIFICATIONS REQUIRED

- Possession of a valid California Class C Driver's License and a good driving record;
- Possession of a valid CPR Certificate;
- Certification as a Chief Fire Officer or completion of required coursework to obtain Executive Chief Fire Officer by the California Fire Service Training and Education System or designation as a Chief Fire Officer (CFO) from the Center for Public Safety Excellence.

EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE

Education:

 Possession of a Bachelor's Degree in Fire Science, Fire Administration or a related field.

Experience:

 Ten (10) years of progressive full-time career fire service experience in a municipal fire department, with at least eight (8) years increasingly responsible professional and administrative experience in all major functions of the fire service, including at least three (3) years in an administrative or supervisory capacity at a FLSA exempt Chief Officer level.

Education and Certifications Desirable:

- · Masters' Degree or equivalent;
- Executive Fire Officer (EFO) Certification from the National Fire Academy;
- Fire Instructor III, Fire Investigator II, and Prevention Officer Certification from the California State Fire Marshal's Office or designation as a Chief Training Officer (CTO) or Fire Marshal (FM) from the Center for Public Safety Excellence.

- Contribute to overall City efficiency and responsiveness to service demands through understanding and implementing City policy;
- Develop and implement the fire department strategic plan and standards of cover, assist in work activities, projects and programs, monitor work flow, review and evaluate work products, methods, and procedures;
- Establish and maintain effective working relationships with governmental officials, employees, the public, and with those contacted in the course of work;
- · Operate a vehicle observing legal and defensive driving practices;
- Perform strategic planning, budget development and oversight, complex analytical work, and responsible administrative work including use of modern office equipment;
- Operate personal computer, database software, and word processing spreadsheets;
- Respond to and process employee grievances in accordance with labor agreements;
- Supervise and evaluate subordinate level personnel;
- Understand and carry out oral and written instructions.

SUPPLEMENTAL INFORMATION:

PHYSICAL DEMANDS AND WORKING CONDITIONS

- Incumbent is an "At Will" employee serving under the direction of the City Manager;
- Incumbent is a Management/Supervisory/Confidential employee per the Meyers-Milias Brown Act;
- Incumbent is required to attend periodic evening meetings and to travel within and out of the City to attend meetings;
- Light work-lifting, carrying, and/or pushing 50 pounds maximum with frequent lifting and/or carrying of objects weighing up to 25 pounds.

City of Clovis DEPUTY FIRE CHIEF

DESCRIPTION:

Under general direction by the Fire Chief, plans, directs, supervises, and coordinates activities of the Emergency Services Bureau or the Life Safety and Enforcement Bureau; acts for the Fire Chief in their absence; and performs related duties as required.

CLASS CHARACTERISTICS:

This class is distinguished from the Fire Chief by its emphasis on providing hands-on departmental direction, whereas the Fire Chief provides strategic, long-term planning extending beyond the scope of departmental administration. Plans, organizes and directs the work of safety and non-safety personnel assigned to either the Emergency Services Bureau or the Life Safety and Enforcement Bureau; positions in this class have considerable independence in determining performance methods from a variety of standard methods and procedures. Incumbents report directly to the Fire Chief receiving general direction to develop and implement work plans defining the goals and objects of the organization's strategic plan. Incumbents are expected to resolve problems confronted through the application of judgment and precedent. Incumbents are expected to develop and recommend new procedures when solutions are inconsistent with departmental procedures and policies. Incumbents will work schedule/hours as assigned by the Fire Chief; and performs related duties as required.

EXAMPLES OF DUTIES:

Assist the Fire Chief in development and administration of rules, regulations, policies, and procedures; create the departmental strategic plan, standards of cover, and fire service accreditation requirements; review the effectiveness of such plans and recommend changes as necessary; provide policy direction to department's management team to enable them to make operational decisions; ensure coordination of operations for activities integrating two or more functions; designate responsibility in areas of functional overlap; evaluate and recommend changes in organization and allocation of staff and equipment in order to meet operational needs; oversee special projects; monitor revenues and expenditures to ensure departmental compliance with budget; evaluate the effectiveness of departmental performance measures and recommend changes and/or improvements as needed; advocate the Fire Department's position to City Council, various boards, commissions, county departments, community groups, outside agencies, and the media; assumes command at or advises incident commander at major emergencies; act as department head in Fire Chief's absence; provide leadership and direction for the department and in the area of public fire safety during the Fire Chief's absence; and perform related work as required.

City of Clovis Battalion Chief

DESCRIPTION:

Under general direction by the Fire Chief or Deputy Fire Chief, to have administrative responsibility to plan, organize and direct shift operations; supervise and direct personnel and equipment at fire and/or emergency scenes; organize the activities of the Fire/EMS training section; serves as a key member of the Fire Department management team; and performs related duties as required. May be assigned as a shift battalion chief and/or assigned on a 40-hour administrative assignment.

CLASS CHARACTERISTICS

Plans, organizes and directs the work of fire fighting personnel; positions in this class have considerable independence in selecting work methods from a variety of standard methods and procedures. Incumbents report directly to the Fire Chief or Deputy Fire Chief. Instructions given by the supervisor generally do not provide all the information needed to cope with emergency situations. Incumbents are expected to resolve problems confronted through the application of judgment and precedent, develop and recommend new procedures when solutions are inconsistent with departmental procedures and policies. Incumbents will work schedule/hours as assigned by the Fire Chief; and performs related duties as required.

EXAMPLES OF DUTIES:

Plan, organize and direct the work of a fire fighting shift; assume control of emergency scenes, making decisions and giving directions on tactics and strategies; provide supervision, direction, training and development of all subordinate staff; develop, coordinate and update training program and recordkeeping system to conform with meeting State guidelines and requirements; coordinate the testing and development of new products, tools, and equipment; responsible for the maintenance of all fire facilities; serve as a qualified Safety Officer; conduct post incident critiques of all major fires or emergencies; present training programs for shift and staff personnel; prepare functional and department budgets; and respond to citizen's inquiries and complaints.

TYPICAL QUALIFICATIONS:

LICENSE AND CERTIFICATIONS REQUIRED

- Possession of a valid California Class B Driver's License or Class C with appropriate endorsements;
- Possession of a valid CPR Certificate:
- Possession of a valid EMT-D Certificate.

Certification:

 Certification as a Chief Fire Officer or completion of required coursework and task book to obtain Chief Fire Officer by the California Fire Service Training and Education System or Chief Fire Officer;

EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE

Education:

 Possession of a Bachelor's Degree in Fire Science, Fire Administration or related field

Experience:

- Five (5) years of full-time experience at or equivalent to the level of Fire Captain in a municipal fire department;
- Acting Battalion Chief experience.

For City Council to approve a resolution authorizing the City Manager to complete a loan application to the California Energy Commission - Energy Conservation Assistance Act Program Loan for supplemental LED Lighting funding.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Compass Energy Solutions (CES) is currently retained by the City as an Energy Services Company (ESCO) and is conducting a city-wide LED lighting project. While onsite, they have conducted a feasibility study of other City facilities not included in the current phase. A number of City facilities have been identified as viable; therefore, CES has identified possible funding sources that could provide funding for an LED lighting project that will be submitted at a later date for City Council consideration and approval.

The California Energy Commission (CEC) currently has \$7 million in Energy Conservation Assistance Act (ECAA) funds that are available to public agencies for energy projects via a 1% interest loan, not to exceed a 20-year term. Loan applications are taken on a first-come, first-served basis. Submitting a CEC Loan application at this time would place the City in line to be evaluated before the ECAA

funds are obligated to other public agencies or exhausted. Submission of the application does not bind the City to completing the loan process, but puts the City in a favorable position for low interest funding when a viable project is approved by Council.

BACKGROUND

CES is currently retained by the City as an ESCO and is conducting implementation of an LED lighting project throughout multiple City facilities. While onsite, they have conducted a feasibility study of other City facilities not included in this phase. CES has identified a number of viable facilities that would produce a positive return on investment and is identifying possible funding sources that could provide funding for the next phase of an LED lighting project. Any recommended project will be submitted for City Council consideration and approval at a later date.

Loan Application Details

A portion of CES's study was to identify possible funding sources to provide funding for viable LED lighting projects. CES recently contacted the CEC and was informed that \$7 million in ECAA funds was still available for public agency energy projects. The ECAA loan has an interest rate of 1% and must be repaid from energy cost savings or other legally available funds within a maximum 20-year term. The loan's term cannot exceed the useful life of loan-funded equipment; therefore, the term of the loan will be determined on a case-by-case basis based upon the estimated annual energy cost savings from the project.

The no-cost ECAA loan applications are being accepted on a first-come, first-served basis. Lighting system upgrades with proven energy and/or demand cost savings are eligible. Submitting a CEC Loan application at this time would strategically place the City in line to be evaluated before the ECAA funds are obligated to other public agencies or exhausted.

The CEC requires a feasibility study (inclusive of calculations, energy bills, budgets and schedules proving a viable project) be submitted with the loan application in tandem with a resolution approved by the governing body. CES has completed a preliminary study that meets the loan application requirements.

Project Loan Strategy

Staff is seeking a maximum loan limit of \$500K in available 1% ECAA funds. CES is completing their feasibility study, with staff returning to City Council in the near future to inform Council of those viable LED lighting project locations. Staff will discuss and seek approval of all final project financing options with appropriate resolutions, final project design, costs, and benefits; and whether or not to move forward with additional projects with CES.

FISCAL IMPACT

The strategic action to apply for a CEC loan application, which until actual loan documents are fully executed, is non-binding; therefore, there is no impact to the FY2018/2019 budget. If the loan is accepted and the project commences, energy savings from the project will exceed the bi-annual loan payment amount, leaving a net zero impact to the budget.

REASON FOR RECOMMENDATION

Staff continues to explore ways of responsibly implementing viable energy projects as a means of reducing facility energy costs and is currently working with CES to determine the viability of an additional phase of the LED lighting project.

CES has identified a 1% ECAA loan administered by the CEC which uses the estimated energy cost savings to repay the loan. Submitting a CEC loan application at this time would strategically place the City in line to be evaluated before the ECAA funds are obligated to other public agencies or exhausted.

ACTIONS FOLLOWING APPROVAL

Staff will coordinate with CES to prepare a CEC-ECAA loan application for City Manager signature, not to exceed \$500K, and accrue all necessary documents to assemble a complete loan application package for submittal to the CEC for evaluation. If approved and a viable project is identified, Staff will return to the City Council to seek approval for an LED lighting project, inclusive of final financing options.



BACKGROUND

DYP 6180, L.P., the developer of Tract 6180, has executed a covenant that this development be annexed to the City of Clovis LMD No. 1. An executed copy can be provided on request. Council formed the original District on July 15, 1985, for the purpose of funding the maintenance of landscaped areas and parks.

City Council Report Tract 6180 LMD Annexation November 5, 2018

Under the provisions of the Landscaping and Lighting Act of 1972 and in accordance with Article XIII C and Article XIII D of Proposition 218, all the owners of property proposed for annexation have provided a written request and consent to annexation and have executed a covenant (petition) indicating acceptance of the annual assessment.

The Covenant provides for the addition of an enhanced landscape maintenance zone for the maintenance of the natural vegetation within Alluvial Drainage Channel and the landscaping of the proposed adjacent trail. Development properties in Tract 6180 will pay the added assessment at the request of the developer. The enhanced, or added, maintenance will be the responsibility of the City.

FISCAL IMPACT

This project will add landscaping to the Landscape Maintenance District No. 1 of the City of Clovis shown as follows:

Two trucks are being replaced based on age and overall condition. The competitively bid contract price for each refuse truck is \$328,958.28 including sales tax. The total for the two trucks is \$657,916.56.

BACKGROUND

The City put out a request for proposals for CNG side loading refuse trucks. One proposal was received from Golden State Peterbilt and met the necessary specifications. The City's CNG residential refuse trucks are currently all Peterbilt chassis with Bridgeport bodies. This allows for ease of repairs and stocking of parts.

FISCAL IMPACT

Funds were included in the 2018-19 Fleet budget and the user section, Solid Waste, will have accumulated the necessary funds for the vehicle replacement. The price is within the budgeted amount.

REASON FOR RECOMMENDATION

Two Side Loaders are being replaced for age. The new Side Loaders meet all emissions required for the City, they are dependable, and will be covered by warranty. FISCAL IMPACT

Sufficient funds are available in the 2018-19 Solid Waste budget. The cost of the wheels is \$102,526.61 including shipping and sales tax.

REASON FOR RECOMMENDATION

The existing wheels are 8 years old and the teeth are worn. New compactor wheels will increase compaction rates and help the City Landfill optimize airspace. The teeth design is only available through Caron Compactor. Staff has evaluated the available equipment and has determined that it will meet the Solid Waste needs.

The first reading for Ordinance Amendment OA2018-03 was considered and approved by the Clovis City Council on October 15, 2018. A component of this approval was a map identifying properties that would accommodate the RHN (Regional Housing Needs) Overlay Zone District.
